*The **Master of Professional Psychology** requires students to complete **300 hours** of professional experience. This supervised professional experience will occur partly through clinical activities in the on-campus Psychology Clinic. Some off-campus clinical placement/context of your learning each semester may also be required.

Sixth Year

Following the successful completion of the Master of Professional Psychology, students are required to complete a sixth year of self-sourced supervised practice in order to meet the requirements for registration as a General Psychologist.

The require number of hours for the Sixth Year is a minimum of 1500 hours, as follows:

- 1360 hours of Placement
- 80 hours of Supervision
- 60 Hours of Professional Development
