Grenby Family Beyond Bond Medal

Bond University recognises the student who has performed at an exceptional level within the Beyond Bond Program in each graduating class. Beyond Bond provides all undergraduate students with a recognition and learning framework embedded within Core Curriculum to enhance employability, whilst providing personalised support to students as they participate in a broad range of academic and extracurricular activities for the duration of their degree. The late Emeritus Professor Mike Grenby devoted himself to Bond students since he joined the University in 1998 until his passing in 2019. The Grenby Family proudly support the Grenby Family Beyond Bond Medal, to nurture and reward the creative spirit of our students. The award includes a medal, certificate and cash prize. Emeritus Professor Grenby introduced the public speaking subject to Bond University in 1999, now offered as a Beyond Bond intensive workshop, The Unfair Advantage - which features the iconic Toga Speech, undertaken by thousands of students.

Professor Nancy Low Choy Memorial Award for Academic Excellence

The University awards the Professor Nancy Low Choy Memorial Award for Academic Excellence to the highest achieving student graduating with the Doctor of Physiotherapy at Bond University once each year. This Award is in memory of Professor Nancy Low Choy, a former Head of Physiotherapy, who led the development of the University's Doctor of Physiotherapy Program and negotiated the final accreditation of Australia's first fully accredited Doctor of Physiotherapy through the Australian Physiotherapy Council allowing the first and subsequent cohorts to graduate as registered physiotherapy practitioners.

Universities and Academic Dress

From the fourteenth and fifteenth centuries western universities began to develop distinctive academic dress and while popular dress moved to less cumbersome and shorter attire, academic dress remained conservative and evolved into the tunica which was a gown worn open at the front. It is from this attire the typical English bachelors' and masters' gowns have evolved. The colour of the robes has an equally long history.

Black has long been the standard colour for bachelors' and masters' robes, although the twentieth century has seen the introduction of various hues. The use of scarlet robes for doctoral degrees dates from the sixteenth century.

The hood was originally no more than a functional medieval head covering, rather like the hood of a modern parka. In monasteries built of stone with little, if any, glazing this article of dress was no doubt welcome, particularly during the northern European winter. In colder climates these hoods were often trimmed with fur. The connection between these early practical solutions to living conditions and modern academic dress may still be seen in the fur-trimmed academic hoods of the University of Sydney.

From the outset the basic organisational unit or form of association in universities was the faculty, a group of scholars who taught the same or related subjects. From the late seventeenth century academic colours were codified in the universities on the basis of faculties.

The trencher or mortarboard hat is from Oxford and Cambridge Universities. In the fourteenth century clergy were ordered to wear a pileus, a simple hat. This was modified by the University of Paris in the sixteenth century into a square cap which, at Oxford and Cambridge, became very large, flat and floppy, underneath which a skull cap was worn. In the seventeenth century the skull cap and the flat square cap became a single item and a board was introduced to the upper portion to prevent the side pieces falling over the face. The tassel was added in the eighteenth century.

At Bond University the academic dress which has been adopted is traditional and typifies that found in most Australian universities. The academic dress comprises of a traditional black gown, a hood and trencher. For its masters' degrees Bond University has chosen a hood made in the blue of the University and lined in the colour of the discipline in which the degree was taken.

For bachelors' degrees the hood is made in black cloth. Colours adopted by Bond University are:

While Bond University is establishing for itself a reputation for innovation in tertiary education, it also sees itself as an institution continuing the traditions of the great universities of the western world. It is for this reason that traditional academic dress has been chosen.

The Bond University Crest

designed by the late Michael Bryce, displays the Southern Cross on a field of stripes. These stripes (representing computer pixels) symbolise "technology" while the wavy bands represent water, a prominent feature of the University and Gold Coast. To complete this picture, a gold sunburst frames the open Book of Knowledge. This complements the University Motto "Forever Learning".

The Bond University Mace - generously donated by long time friends and benefactors of the University, the late Dr John Kearney, AO, QC and Mrs Alison Kearney.

The Mace, a club-like weapon, has throughout western history also represented a ceremonial symbol of office. In universities the Mace signifies the high office of the Chancellor and is borne before the Chancellor on ceremonial occasions such as graduations.

Bond University's Mace was designed by Dr Ian Ferguson, a metal artist, formerly a Post-Doctoral Fellow at RMIT University and now a Research Fellow at Manchester University. The Mace was fabricated in collaboration with Melbourne based metal artist, Karl Millard, who teaches jewellery and metal work at RMIT.

The ball of the Mace is highly polished silver using a metalworking technique developed in Japan 300 years ago, known as Mokume Gane (literally 'eye of the wood grain metal' which refers to the pattern forged into katana or sword blades). Bond's armorial bearing is bezel set to the head of the mace in enamel.

The staff of the Mace has been shaped from gidgee (Acacia Cambagei), a slow growing Australian hardwood found in arid areas and used by Aboriginal people to make their spears.
