Fire	Raise Alarm - Dial 7111 Notify Unit Head
Medical Emergency	Raise Alarm - Dial 88 Give brief description
Personal Threat	Dial 7111 - Notify Unit Head State location and threat
Bomb Threat	Dial 7111 - State location and Threat. Do not touch object
Internal Emergency	Dial 7111 - Notify Unit Head State location and incident
External Emergency	Dial 7111 - Notify Unit Head State location and incident
Evacuation	Act as instructed, check all rooms. Assemble. Head Count
All Clear	Return to normal duties

CODE RED

In the event of a fire follow the
RACE principles



REMOVE

If safe, **rescue** anyone in danger and **remove** them from the immediate threat



ALERT

Use a **MCP**, shout out “Fire, Fire, Fire”, and advise **Emergency Warden / Officer**



CONTAIN

Attempt to **contain** by closing doors and windows during evacuation



EVACUATE

If safe and trained, **extinguish** the fire

OnAlert® Emergency Response e-Learning for Healthcare Facilities

The learning provided is based on Australian Standard 4083 Planning for Emergencies - Healthcare Facilities. The information set out below is an outline of the various emergency codes and acts as a learning guide only. For greater detail, please refer to the Emergency Procedures Manual located in your department.

The RACE Principle

The RACE principle can be applied to all emergencies.

REMOVE

Those in immediate danger only if safe to do so

ALERT

Other people and the appropriate Emergency Services

CONTAIN

Close doors and windows.
In case of Bomb Threat – open them

EVACUATE

Evacuate and EXTINGUISH – only if safe to do so



OnAlert® Initial Response to an Emergency

Fire / Smoke

Code Red

A staff member discovering, or being made aware of, the fire/smoke shall carry out the following:

- Remove patients, staff and visitors who are in immediate danger only if safe to do so
- Break nearest Break Glass Alarm (BGA) if available
- Dial Emergency Number, state CODE RED and location x 2
- Seek assistance from other staff and notify Area Warden
- Isolate threat – close all doors and windows
- Attempt to extinguish the fire using appropriate fire extinguishers, hose reels or fire blankets ONLY if safe to do so

Medical Emergency

Code Blue

Person discovering medical emergency:

- Assess patient and seek assistance from other staff
- Dial Emergency Number, state CODE BLUE and location x 2
- Commence CPR and consider defibrillation ASAP

Bomb Threat

Code Purple

If the bomb threat is received by telephone, the person receiving the call should:

- Remain calm, begin completing information required on Bomb Threat Checklist
- Keep the caller occupied on the line as long as possible and DO NOT disconnect the call
- Attract other staff's attention. They will Dial Emergency Number, state CODE PURPLE and location x 2
- All communications are to be via landline, WIPs and runners ONLY
- If suspicious object is discovered, do not handle object and clear area of ALL occupants
- All relevant egress routes and Safe Assembly Areas must be searched for suspicious objects
- Doors and windows should be left OPEN

Internal Emergency

Code Yellow

Failure of internal services which may constitute a Code Yellow emergency can include electricity, natural gas, ventilation systems, illegal occupancy, hazardous substances incident etc.

- Assist anyone in immediate danger, only if safe to do so
- Dial Emergency Number, state CODE YELLOW and location x 2
- Calm and reassure patients and visitors
- Stand by for further instructions

Personal Threat

Code Black / Grey

If confronted by a potential aggressor:

- Obey all of the offenders instructions and speak in a non-threatening manner
- Try to move everyone in possible danger out of the way
- Never pursue a potentially dangerous person
- If possible, Dial Emergency Number, state CODE BLACK/GREY and location x 2 or activate duress alarm if available
- Carefully observe the offender(s) as much as possible

External Emergency

Code Brown

This Code pertains to major disasters or incidents which occur away from the facility, for example major industrial accident, major terrorist incident etc.

Evacuation

Code Orange

Evacuation involves the movement of patients, staff and other personnel within or out of the facility in as rapid and safe a manner as possible. Three primary stages of evacuation exist:

Immediate Evacuation	Away from immediate threatened area
Lateral Evacuation	To an adjoining wing of the facility
Total Evacuation	Evacuees taken to external Safe Assembly Areas
