Option 1: Select fifty credit points (50CP) of Undergraduate Law electives from the Faculty of Law's offerings ** plus ten credit points (10CP) of general electives.

Option 2: Choose a sixty credit point (60CP) optional Law Major in either Climate Law or Legal Transformation

Option 3: Choose a forty credit point (40CP) Law Specialisation from the list below, plus an additional ten credit point (10CP) Law elective and ten credit point (10CP) of general electives.

To be eligible for a Law Specialisation, students must complete a minimum of four (4) Law Electives (40 credit points) within one of the above areas. Eligible students will receive a Specialisation Certificate at the completion of their program.
