





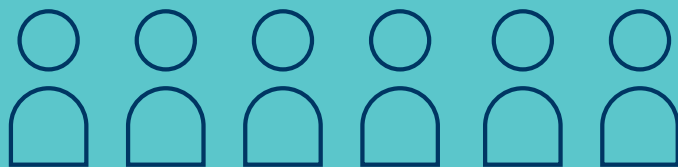

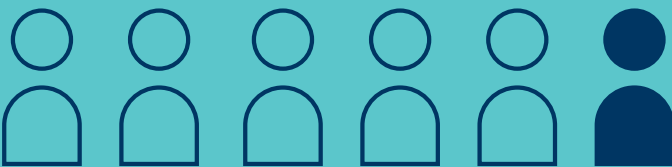

Usman Khawaja is driving inclusion in Australian sport

Rising through the ranks of Australian cricket, all Usman Khawaja wanted was to blend in. "I didn't listen to the same music. My heroes were very different to the guys around me in the team," he says. "The early part of my career and life was just about trying to fit in."

Khawaja grew up in Westmead in Sydney's west, during a time when most of the community around him knew little about Islam or his culture. His affinity for cricket grew from being able to play sport with his peers before he could speak with them in English.

He became the first Muslim and first Pakistani-born player to play Test cricket for Australia, debuting in his first international match at 24. As well as breaking down barriers through playing on the world stage, he founded the Usman Khawaja Foundation. It aims to help disadvantaged youth by providing educational and cricketing opportunities.

Khawaja's objective is to find ways to inspire people to achieve more and represent Australia, regardless of gender or other barriers. He wants to make positive change around inclusion and multiculturalism through the Usman Khawaja Foundation as well as Cricket Australia and other organisations but wants more experience and knowledge to add value.

That's why he turned to study – specifically, a Master of Business Administration (MBA) at Bond – to help make an impact.

"I need to be able to understand how an organisation works and functions, how finance and economic times impact social constructs – so many different things," says Khawaja. "I want to be equipped to add value to those boards, to add value to what we're trying to achieve, wherever I am, rather than be a passenger."

Choose your postgraduate path

Graduate certificate

A graduate certificate can be completed in just one semester full time – four months at Bond. It is a postgraduate credential usually focused on a specific area of study. It typically includes four subjects.

Graduate diploma

A graduate diploma usually includes eight subjects and can be completed in two semesters – or eight months – full time at Bond.

Master's degree

A master's degree is a high-level qualification that can be completed in one to two years full time at Bond. Master's degree graduates demonstrate a strong understanding in a particular area of study. Many master's programs at Bond are accredited with professional organisations.

Research degree

Higher degree by research is an advanced postgraduate qualification that focuses on independent, original investigation into a specific topic or problem. Unlike coursework degrees, research degrees require students to conduct in-depth research, produce a substantial thesis, and contribute new knowledge to their field.

Microcredential

Microcredentials are professional development short courses designed with industry to provide rapid upskilling in high-demand areas.

They are often online and self-paced or may include instructor-led workshops and coaching sessions. Microcredential achievement is recognised with a digital certificate and, in some cases, academic credit towards a postgraduate degree.

Executive learning

Executive learning options provide industry professionals with an opportunity to elevate skills and knowledge while also boosting confidence and driving innovation. We offer existing courses and bespoke solutions for teams, with flexible online, in-person, and blended learning options available.

Note: For graduate certificate, graduate diploma and master's programs, each subject requires, on average, one two-hour forum and one two-hour tutorial per week. Students should allow approximately six hours per subject per week for at-home preparation, additional reading and assignments – but this will vary from subject to subject.

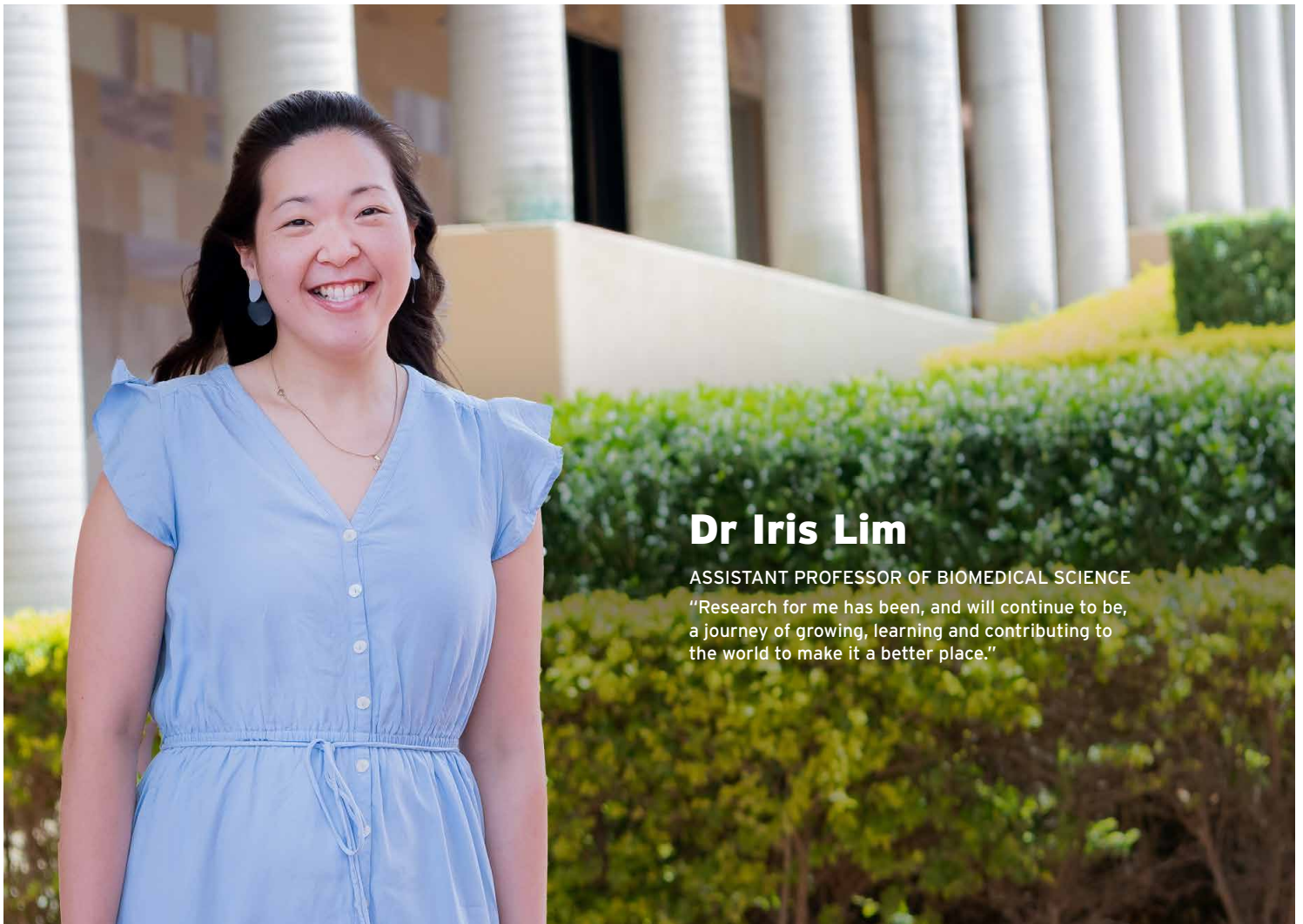

Financing your degree

If you choose to complete postgraduate study at Bond, you can access a number of financing options to support your studies, from the Australian Government's interest-free FEE-HELP scheme, through to loyalty discounts and student funds.

FEE-HELP

FEE-HELP is an interest-free student loan program funded by the Australian Government for all Australian citizens and others who meet the eligibility requirements.

As of 2025, students can borrow up to \$126,839 for any program except medicine, which has a limit of \$182,172. Repayments are made through the taxation system at a minimum rate of 1 per cent per annum when your annual income reaches \$54,435 (2024-25 financial year). The rate of repayment increases as annual income increases.

You can apply for FEE-HELP online using your Student Identification Number once you have received an offer from Bond University.

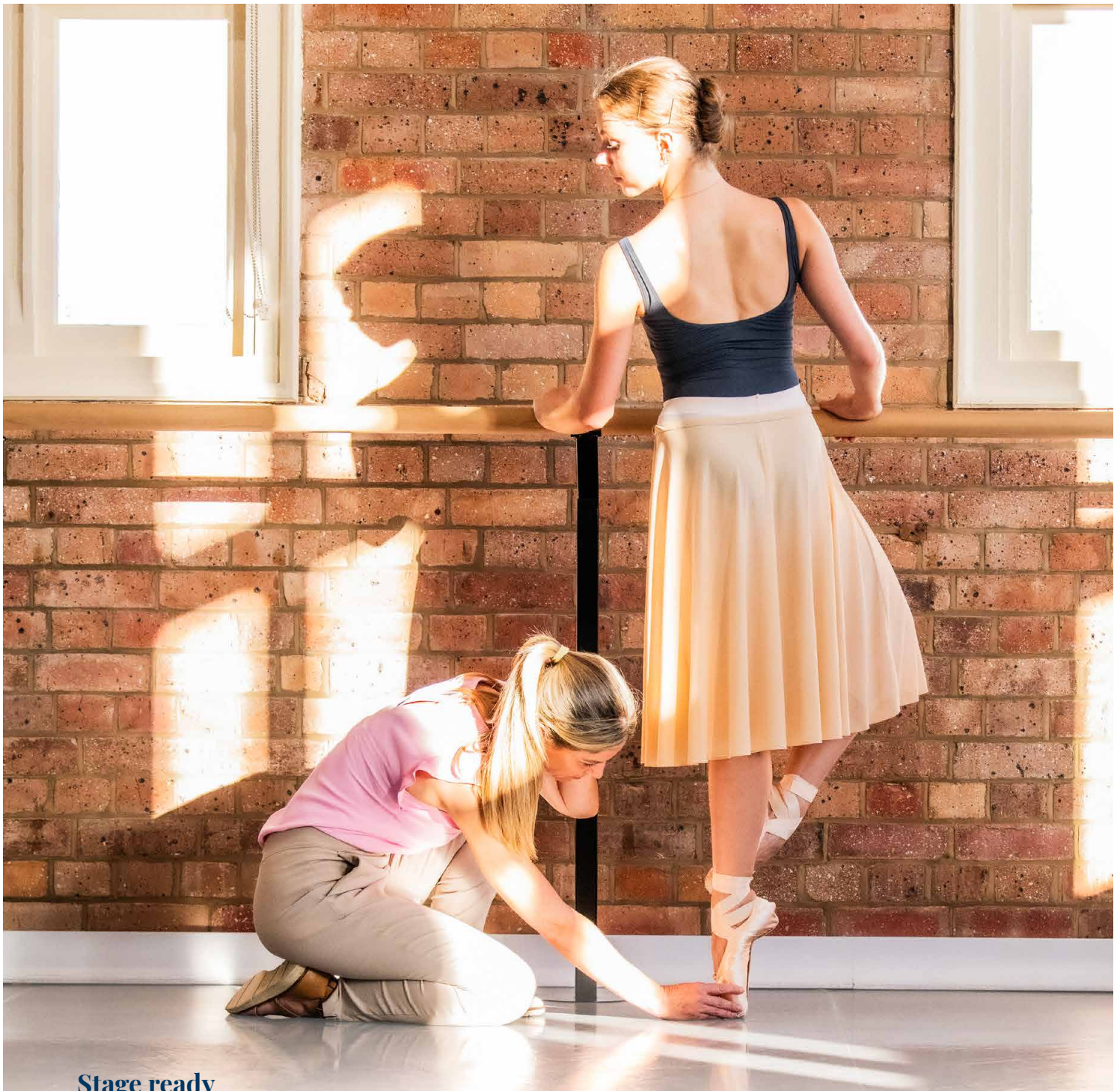

Loyalty discounts

Bond offers a number of loyalty discounts to students who have a direct family member attending an eligible program at Bond or who have completed an eligible program here. These loyalty programs may provide a reduction of up to 10 per cent on tuition fees.

Stage ready

Renee Meffan was just a teenager when she realised a gap in specialised physiotherapy knowledge was letting dancers down. As a dancer and cheerleader, she sought physiotherapy for injury prevention and management but couldn't find a physiotherapist knowledgeable about her sport.

"When I was using dance terminology to describe an experience of pain or discomfort, I didn't have a physiotherapist who had a comprehensive understanding of what was happening with my body," says Renee.

"There were a lot of physiotherapists specialising in sports like soccer, AFL and NRL.

"I realised how valuable it would be for dancers like me to have better access to specialist dance physiotherapists."

She gained a Doctor of Physiotherapy degree at Bond University to fill that gap. It was the beginning of a vibrant and fulfilling career.

"A big part of being a physiotherapist is teaching people about their body, and that their body is never working against them, it always tries to help," she says.

Renee travelled the world with The Walt Disney Company before returning home to launch her performing arts physiotherapy clinic. She now supports Queensland Ballet's elite athletes and runs workshops with Gold Coast dance studios. Renee believes health education and research will improve the performing world by leaps, bounds and pirouettes.

"I love seeing people get back on stage after an injury and teaching them how to train safely and manage their load to return to dance."

Applications for the Medical Program are only open to domestic students and must be lodged through the Queensland Tertiary Admissions Centre (QTAC) at qtac.edu.au.

4 Upload all required documents

Make sure you complete all required fields in your application form and upload any required documentation. You may be asked to submit documentation including:

- Academic transcripts
 - Photo identification
 - Professional references
 - Any other documents required for specific programs

5 Submit your application

Agree to the application declaration and click 'Submit'. You'll receive an email from Bond University to confirm your application was successfully submitted. The application review process will normally take two weeks, provided all your supporting documentation has been received.

6 Receive and accept your Letter of Offer

If your application is successful, you will receive an official offer for your postgraduate program via email. To accept your offer, log in to our online application service and follow the instructions to complete the FEE-HELP form online or pay the required fees as listed on your offer.

7 Complete the Academic Skills for Postgraduate Success microcredential

Delivered online, this free microcredential aims to refresh your academic study skills to ensure you are confident studying discipline-specific content at a postgraduate level.
